# **The Childhood Story**

## **Luke 2:42-45**

**42 When Jesus was twelve years old, they attended the festival as usual.**

**43 After the celebration was over, they started home to Nazareth, but Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents didn't miss him at first,**

**44 because they assumed he was among the other travelers. But when he didn't show up that evening, they started looking for him among their relatives and friends.**

**45 When they couldn't find him, they went back to Jerusalem to search for him there.**

## **Luke 2:46-49**

**46 Three days later they finally discovered him in the Temple, sitting among the religious teachers, listening to them and asking questions.**

**47 All who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers.**

**48 His parents didn't know what to think. "Son," his mother said to him, "why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been frantic, searching for you everywhere."**

**49 "But why did you need to search?" he asked. "Didn't you know that I must be in my Father's house?"**



# **The Ministry Story**

## **John 6:5-9**

**5** When Jesus looked out and saw that a large crowd had arrived, he said to Philip, “Where can we buy bread to feed these people?” He said this to stretch Philip’s faith. He already knew what he was going to do.

**7** Philip answered, “Two hundred silver pieces wouldn’t be enough to buy bread for each person to get a piece.”

**8-9** One of the disciples—it was Andrew, brother to Simon Peter—said, “There’s a little boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But that’s a drop in the bucket for a crowd like this.”



## **John 6:10-11**

**10-11 Jesus said, “Make the people sit down.” There was a nice carpet of green grass in this place. They sat down, about five thousand of them. Then Jesus took the bread and, having given thanks, gave it to those who were seated. He did the same with the fish. All ate as much as they wanted.**

## **Luke 4:28-30**

**28 When they heard this, the people in the synagogue were furious.**

**29 Jumping up, they mobbed him and forced him to the edge of the hill on which the town was built. They intended to push him over the cliff,**

**30 but he passed right through the crowd and went on his way.**

## **John 8:58-59**

**58 Jesus said to them, “Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM.”**

**59 Then they took up stones to throw at Him; but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple, going through the midst of them, and so passed by.**

## **John 10:17-18**

**17 “The Father loves me because I am willing to give up my life, in order that I may receive it back again.**

**18 No one takes my life away from me. I give it up of my own free will. I have the right to give it up, and I have the right to take it back. This is what my Father has commanded me to do.”**

## **Matthew 26:39,42-44**

**39 He went a little farther on, threw himself face downwards on the ground, and prayed, “My Father, if it is possible, take this cup of suffering from me! Yet not what I want, but what you want.”**

**42 Once more Jesus went away and prayed, “My Father, if this cup of suffering cannot be taken away unless I drink it, your will be done.”**

**43 He returned once more and found the disciples asleep; they could not keep their eyes open.**

**44 Again Jesus left them, went away, and prayed the third time, saying the same words.**

## **Isaiah 53:5-6**

**5 But he was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins.  
He was beaten so we could be whole.  
He was whipped so we could be healed.**

**6 All of us, like sheep, have strayed away.  
We have left God's paths to follow our own.  
Yet the LORD laid on him the sins of us all.**

## **Matthew 28:1-4**

**1 Early on Sunday morning, as the new day was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went out to visit the tomb.**

**2 Suddenly there was a great earthquake! For an angel of the Lord came down from heaven, rolled aside the stone, and sat on it.**

**3 His face shone like lightning, and his clothing was as white as snow.**

**4 The guards shook with fear when they saw him, and they fell into a dead faint.**



## **Matthew 28:5-8**

**5 Then the angel spoke to the women. “Don’t be afraid!” he said. “I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified.**

**6 He isn’t here! He is risen from the dead, just as he said would happen. Come, see where his body was lying.**

**7 And now, go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and he is going ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there. Remember what I have told you.”**

**8 The women ran quickly from the tomb. They were very frightened but also filled with great joy, and they rushed to give the disciples the angel’s message.**
